It all started when two ordinary people in Todmorden (*size of Penrith*) planted a patch of rhubarb next to a bus stop. Now the town has 500 community food growing areas.

A simple act of planting rhubarb has started a 'world-wide' revolution in growing fruit & vegetables that passers-by can pick and eat for dinner!
